This issue of Scottish Renewables' Monthly Briefing looks at the new Lobbying Act, which comes into force on Monday, 12 March.

The Act introduces a Lobbying Register, which will be a publicly-accessible database of contacts between anyone who speaks with Members of the Scottish Parliament and civil service figures from the Scottish Parliament and Government about their work, unless they are exempt.



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Scottish Renewables in Parliament

Deputy Chief Executive Jenny Hogan represented the industry at a Scottish Parliament Local Government and <u>Communities Committee</u> meeting on the Planning Bill.

Jenny <u>pressed the case</u> against the introduction of a third-party right of appeal, and ensured that the renewables sector's voice was heard by the Committee, which is currently considering the Bill at stage one of the Parliamentary process.

Scottish National Investment Bank

SR attended the launch of a report into the establishment of a Scottish National Investment Bank and used the opportunity to ask First Minister Nicola Sturgeon whether it would provide a new means of funding marine energy.

Scottish Renewables' Annual Conference

First Minister Nicola Sturgeon will take to the podium on <u>day one</u> to set out her commitment to green energy.

Climate Change Plan

The Scottish Government's final Climate Change Plan was published on February 28.

Scottish Renewables <u>responded</u> by welcoming its overall direction, but criticised "a significant drop in ambition in decarbonising the heat sector".

Expression of interest: Decentralised Low Carbon Power Sector Deal

Scottish Renewables has contributed to a paper which outlines the benefits of a sector deal for decentralised low carbon power to BEIS. The paper has been developed alongside a number of other trade bodies representing small and medium-scale generators, demand-side response and electricity storage.

Non-Domestic (Business) Rates Legislation 2018-19 laid in Scottish Parliament

Eight pieces of Business Rates legislation for 2018-19 have been laid in Parliament and, subject to Parliamentary approval, will come into force on 1 April 2018. Of relevance is that:

- The poundage rate has been set at 48.0 pence
- <u>Thresholds for the Large Business Supplement have been set</u>
- <u>Aberdeen city/shire offices see relief</u>
- <u>Hydro generation sites see relief where the rateable value is under £5 million</u>

Scoping workshop for sectoral marine plan for offshore wind energy


