For five years Scottish Renewables has made one policy issue central to our engagement with UK Government: the reinstatement of access to the Contracts for Difference mechanism for onshore wind and large solar PV.

This week Ministers responded, acknowledging that "ending our contribution to climate change means making the most of every technology available".

2021's auction will now be open to all, with a consultation - to which SR will of course respond - setting out proposals to support innovative technology, like tidal and wave power and floating wind, too.

### **COP26** roundtable and reception

### **SR NPF4 Position Paper submitted**

After one of the most complex policy development processes in recent years, <u>Scottish Renewables' Position Statement on National Planning Framework 4 (NPF4)</u> has been finalised and submitted to the Scottish Government's <u>Call for Ideas</u> on NPF4. Our Position Statement will form the basis of an advocacy campaign with key stakeholders to build awareness and support for our policy asks.

We have already begun engagement with the Scottish Government's Wind Energy Policy and Development Team, Planning & Architecture Team and NPF4 Team, and will continue to work with them and other key stakeholders on the development of NPF4 over the coming months.



# New funding announced in Scottish Government Budget

A new £120 million 'Heat Transition Deal' has been announced by the Scottish Government that will provide a £50 million 'Heat Networks Early Adopters Fund' to local authorities, and £10 million for hydrogen heat projects. Use of the final £60m has yet to confirmed and we are seeking to meet officials to understand more.

#### **Heat Networks Bill unveiled**

The Scottish Government has published a draft of its Heat Networks Bill which proposes to introduce a licence for heat network operation and measures to de-risk investment in the sector, something that we have been working hard on members' behalf to achieve. The Bill will now be scrutinised by the Scottish Parliament with assent hopefully granted by early 2021.

#### CfD - changes for AR4

The announcement that onshore wind and solar projects will be able to take part in the next round of the Contracts for Difference auction was part of a <u>wider consultation</u> seeking views on a number of proposals to the next CfD Allocation Round 4, including, but not limited to:

- · Creating a new 'Pot 3' solely for offshore wind
- Defining floating offshore wind as a separate eligible technology with a distinct administrative strike price
- Extending the delivery years from 2026 to March 31, 2030.
- Reviewing and strengthening the current policy on Supply Chain Plans
- Seeking views on barriers to storage co-located with CfD projects and amending the existing negative pricing rule
